



School Sports Funding at Uplands Primary School

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government has provided funds over the past few years to enable schools to develop the quality of sport and PE for all their children. This has been a great opportunity for Uplands to raise the profile of PE and ensure that we are supporting our pupils to keep healthy, develop a love of sport and promote teamwork. The funding is to be used on improving the provision of PE and sport. Schools have freedom in how this money is spent. For example, the money can be spent on employing specialist PE teachers or qualified coaches to work alongside teachers in lessons to increase their subject knowledge and confidence in PE, running competitions and encouraging pupils to participate in school games and buying materials to develop PE within the school.

Key achievements to date – What have we achieved over the past few years?	What would we like to improve this year?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ We have continued to invest money in staff development to ensure that teachers are equipped with the confidence to teach PE effectively such as British Gymnastics certifications gained for teaching staff. ➤ Support from a PE specialist resulted in staff having a clear, progressive scheme of work to follow throughout the school. ➤ We continue to work alongside Cams Hill senior school who have offered expertise in PE. Staff in year 3-4 have benefitted from the expertise and developed strategies which have improved the quality of lessons. ➤ For the past four years, a group of Y5 pupils have been trained to run active games at lunchtime and they have enjoyed this. This training will be renewed in February 2024 for a new cohort, delivered by PE subject lead and PE development manager at Hampshire. ➤ We have held successful and enjoyable School Games events each year and have redesigned our Sports day. This year was the second year we delivered games day for the whole school across one morning. We listened to feedback from parents and children and ensured that games day was a short morning and bought the date forward so that we were future proof with the weather. ➤ Equipment has been replaced when lost or damaged and we now have the right equipment to teach effectively including new netball hoops permanently fixed in the playground. A new storage facility was built in time September 2022 to store KS1 resources which ensured we have access to resources to support delivery of PE. ➤ We have invested in high quality storage units so that teaching resources can be rotated based on what unit is being taught. We have also invested in 4 high quality trolleys, so that staff can keep equipment for units each half term, rather than spending time going to the PE shed – impacting on time that could be spent delivering curriculum. ➤ Raised the profile of PE teaching. It continues to be a protected 2 hours a week. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Contribution to groundwork across the school – in particular permanent astro turf ground works and laying of materials ➤ Continue to release subject leader for moderating and taking sports teams to competitions. ➤ Outdoor leader updates for existing staff ➤ Continue to offer an extensive after school club sporting/activity provision to encourage families in receipt of the pupil premium funding to access sport/activity outside of school and enhance their awareness of activities accessible to them, signposting them to the most appropriate provision. ➤ Continue to grow opportunities for KS2 chn to take part in competitive and non-competitive tournaments through Hampshire

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ We have Lunchtime Supervisors to run games/activities at lunchtime who have received training for ‘Active Lunchtimes’ in order to ensure that we are maximizing opportunities for pupils to be active during their lunchtime. ➤ We have invested money in lunchtime equipment – including alternative provision like spike ball nets, tchoukball nets and balance boards. ➤ This academic year we reviewed the offer of after school provision, and decided to develop school staff to deliver clubs opposed to external coaches. One reason for this was the significant increase in fees for coaches and another was to develop current ECT’s and support staff. This year we have invested a significant amount of time to this and as a result over 50% of the children in our school have engaged in an afterschool or lunchtime club. ➤ We have developed our relationship with Hampshire Games and have taken part in 13 competitions over the last 2 years, alongside other internal events. This has led to the school being awarded the silver Standard from the Hampshire Games. Last year we gained bronze! ➤ We have continued to extend our swimming provision into Y6 so pupils not meeting the standard by the end of Y5 have had an extra opportunity. ➤ This year we have seen a 55% uptake of afterschool and lunchtime attendance compared to 31% in June 2022. The newly elected Subject Lead has worked hard to increase participation especially in the deprived and pupil premium demographics. Priority places were given to pupil premium and SEN children. <p>General over the last few years</p> <p>In June 2022, our whole school took part in athlete event to promote physical activity and learn about the ethos of the commonwealth games. The school raised £4300 pound which then got re-invested back into gymnasium equipment.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ New Subject leader has continued to work with other schools and Hampshire to share good practice. Including attending Hampshire PE network meetings ➤ PE lead attended the Hampshire PE conference and gained valuable skills and insights into task adaptation for SEN children ➤ We have utilized the funding diligently by identifying talent in the workforce who we believe will add significant value to our vision for PE. This is in the form of a PESS Level 3 qualification to enable this member of staff to deliver PE independently of a teacher present – this has been a 2 year program and this member of staff has successfully passed all her modules and is awaiting her final sign off. ➤ In May 2022 the school has purchased 60 bikes. 30 balance bikes and 30 pedal bikes for KS2, including safe stargaze for these bikes. ➤ In May 2022, LKS2 took part in a pilot study ‘sponsor a school’ provided by Fareham Leisure center, PE lead worked closely with the manager of the center to provide an activity program, in line with the PE curriculum and also to provide children with opportunities outside of their every day experiences. Our Uplands community have also benefitted from access to the center to promote physical activity. This will also support staff in planning and recognizing the needs of our children especially our SEN children. ➤ Continue to support children to develop swimming life skills and cycling skills, delivered by qualified coaches. ➤ Deliver scooter training for all key stage 1 children ➤ Continue to work with external sports agencies to increase participation. In 2023/24 teach to work with England Netball and British Bowls association. ➤ The school will contribute to the cost of adventurous activities for year 6 - to reduce the cost for families especially those most deprived ➤ Continue to re-invest in equipment that may need updating, repairing or replacing. ➤ Train 2 teachers to coach netball and rugby to develop our coaching provision ➤ Updates for British gymnastics

- Invested in sensory circuits equipment to support the delivery
- Invested in staff training for MIDAS, so that more competitions could be attended.
- Developed link with community action so that the school can hire their minibuses at a significantly reduce price.
- 2 support staff involved in a pilot project for cycling
- Outdoor leader training updates – reviewed annually
- Gymnastics training for ECT's
- Dance training for ECT'S
- Investment into whole school PE planning – online platform with resources and videos, to support teaching and reduce workload
- HLTA attended goal ball and LTA training and delivered training to teaching staff
- Whole school cycling training for teaching staff.
- We have continued to offer provision for bikeability training for years 5/6
- New year 3/4 cycling curriculum rolled out this year following staff training.
- We have invested in competition sports kit
- Key stage 1 and year R had balance bike (year R) and scooter training (KS1 – Road Safety)
- Calshot contributions for adventurous activities in year 6 – continuing into this academic year
- We have invested in new tents to support our year 3/4 camp residential.
- A new bike shed with base was laid to facilitate 30 new bikes which are now being used in PE curriculum

July 24 update

- Cross curricular orienteering posts permanent posts put up around to school – to bring more active learning across the key stages. Staff had training on how to facilitate this also
- Updates for staff on how to deliver gymnastics successfully and safely in line with NC guidance and school curriculum
- PE lead continuing to attend PE network meetings when available to do so
- Investment in buckets of active break resources for key stages to have for play
- Play leader training continues to be successful every year
- Astro turf fitted in an area of the playground. This is used across the school and used throughout active breaks, PE lessons and After school sports clubs. Having this space has allowed outside PE in slippery conditions to still go ahead, without injury
- Swimming lessons to boost those children with less experience and not meeting the DFE guidelines for swimming
